As we adapt to the current situation, we also recognize the long-term impacts of this pandemic on research programs, researchers and on cancer patients. We acknowledge the possibility that some research objectives may not be met, but we're committed to supporting the community through this continued period of disruption. At OICR, our priority is, and always will be, advancing cancer research in Ontario. We are working with our funder, the Government of Ontario's Ministry of Colleges and Universities (MCU), to identify any needed longer-term strategies to support your currently funded ongoing programs that may need supplemental funding into the next fiscal year to complete milestones and deliverables, as well as to support the positions of critical staff. As we engage MCU on these and other matters, we will have more updates for you in terms of what is possible and what is not. We are committed to supporting cancer research and working together with you now and for years to come.
